FIRST READING Malachi 3:1-4

The Lord God says this: Look, I am going to send my messenger to prepare a way before me. And the Lord you are seeking will suddenly enter his Temple; and the angel of the covenant whom you are longing for, yes, he is coming, says the Lord of Hosts. Who will be able to resist the day of his coming? Who will remain standing when he appears? For he is like the refiner's fire and the fullers' alkali. He will take his seat as refiner and purifier; he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and then they will make the offering to the Lord as it should be made. The offering of Judah and Jerusalem will then be welcomed by the Lord as in former days, as in the years of old.

Since all the children share the same blood and flesh, Jesus too shared equally in it, so that by his death he could take away all the power of the devil, who had power over death, and set free all those who had been held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death. For it was not the angels that he took to himself; he took to himself descent from Abraham. It was essential that he should in this way become completely like his brothers so that he could be a compassionate and trustworthy high priest of God's religion, able to atone for human



sins. That is, because he has himself been through temptation he is able to help others who are tempted.

CALL FOR NOMINATION OF DELEGATES TO THE PLENARY COUNCIL

Bishop Greg O'Kelly SJ is calling for people to nominate to be delegates for the Archdiocese for the Plenary Council's two sessions in October this year and June-July 2021.

Four delegates will be selected from priests, religious and lay people willing to be nominated or who nominate themselves. The delegates will need to demonstrate that

- they are committed to leadership and ministry in the Church
- they are living the Gospel in their life prayer and action
- they have an awareness of the "big picture" of Catholic life in Australian society
- they have participated in the Plenary Listening and Dialogue and Listening and Discernment phases
- they have the capacity to discern with an open heart, listening to what the Spirit is saying to the Church in Australia.

All delegates will be required to attend a preparatory day in June or July. The First Session is from October 4 -11, and the Second Session from June 28 - July 3, 2021.

GALILEE OP SHOP 2020

Officially the Op Shop reopened last Wednesday - 29 January - and will be trading each Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, apart from Good Friday and the winter school holidays. Opening hours are 9.15am to 3.00pm.

However, before and after Christmas, we responded to several local calls for support related to the bushfires. A couple close to a Hills woman with six children (who lost all but the clothes they were wearing) collected plates, mugs, coffee cups, glasses, bedding and clothes on their behalf. A generous individual, connected with our shop, donated \$200 cash.

Next we sorted pure cotton sheets and pillow slips to be sewn into pouches for burned animals on Kangaroo Island which is, of course, part of our wider Cluster of Parishes.

Lastly we took two carloads of specified items to be dropped off to the Lions Club further south, for transport to the Island – toys, books, nappies, sun hats and caps, books, games, kitchenware and blankets. This donation was pictured on the Aldinga & Surrounds Community Forum.

It was wonderful that we had enough items on hand to be able to reach out and contribute in this way.

Simeon's words in today's Gospel, known as the Canticle of Simeon, are typically prayed at the end of each day. This evening, pray Simeon's words before you go to sleep. Ask God to let you sleep in peace, knowing God's promise to be with you. Rest confident and assured that Christ is the light that destroys all darkness.



Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God; and he said:

'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.'


As the child's father and mother stood there wondering at the things that were being said about him, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'You see this child: he is destined for the fall and for the rising of many in Israel, destined to be a sign that is rejected – and a sword will pierce your own soul too – so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare.'

There was a prophetess also, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was well on in years. Her days of girlhood over, she had been married for seven years before becoming a widow. She was now eighty-four years old and never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer. She came by just at that moment and began to praise God; and she spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Jerusalem.

When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. Meanwhile the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.

DID YOU KNOW?

- 'The Law of the Lord' refers to the Torah, or the first five books of the Jewish Scriptures, sometimes called the Pentateuch. It was believed that these five books were written by Moses thus the law of Moses.
- The Torah contains many regulations and laws relating to how Jews should lead their lives, including ritual purification. Leviticus 12 outlines the regulations that tell how a woman must become purified after childbirth, a process that included a ritual bath and the offering of a sacrifice of pigeons or doves.
- Mary and Joseph are acting as practising, pious Jews in following the requirements of the Law after the birth of Jesus.
- This text is unique to Luke's Gospel. No other gospel tells us as much of the early years of Jesus as Luke does.
