The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

CHAPEL STREET LAND

Many people would be aware that the Parish owns a two acre block of land to the south of St Joseph's Hall, Church and Cemetery in Willunga. This land has been owned by the Willunga Parish since the 1800's.

The land is subject to hefty Onkaparinga Council and SA Water rates, which have now escalated to over \$8,000 per year (and still rising). These expenses are met from dwindling parish resources, especially the second collection. In addition, we have quite a few costs and many volunteer hours to maintain this area in a neat, fire-safe and snake-safe condition.

At a time when the age of many of our parishioners is increasing, our parish income is decreasing and the needs of our community are changing, it is the belief of the Parish Finance Council that we should not leave this resource empty and unused. This matter has been discussed several times over the last decade. One idea that was investigated in the past was to lease the land to a developer for a retirement complex. Several groups have shown mild interest, but no projects have gone ahead. We (the Parish Finance Council) believe there is enough interest to convince us that the matter is worth pursuing again.

We have been very blessed in the past to have the invaluable support of various nuns working as Pastoral Associates in our Parish. We know this help is not going to continue indefinitely and we will need to employ a Pastoral Associate to continue this essential work. In our current financial situation it will be extremely difficult to fund this position on an on-going basis, without a significant injection of funds.

It is important to remember that NO DECISIONS have been made about anything, and nothing will be done without adequate consultation with all three of the communities that make up the Willunga Parish.

To this end, Fr Josy will chair meetings with interested parishioners at each of our Mass centres to discuss how best to involve everybody in deciding what to do. We want this to be a totally open and transparent consultation so that we get to a negotiated decision which will be in the long-term interests of everybody.

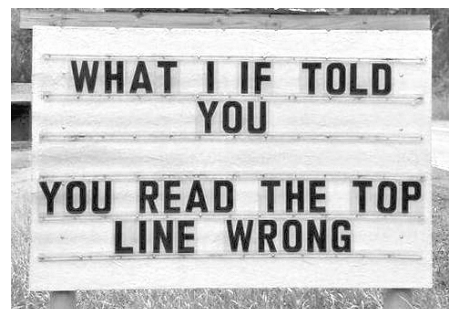

mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.

DID YOU KNOW?

The first commandment which Jesus quotes is the great Jewish prayer known as the Shema (Deut 6:4-5). Even today this prayer is recited each morning and evening by practising Jews.

- In traditional Jewish practice the Shema is written on a slip of paper and placed inside the mezuzah, a small box beside the front doors of Jewish homes. Each time a person passes through the door, they touch the mezuzah in a symbolic action of reciting this great prayer. It is a way of reminding themselves often during the day of God's greatness and their obligation to love him.

- The second commandment quoted by Jesus comes from Leviticus 19:18. Both commandments are part of the Torah or Law.

EXPLORING THE WORD

Mark's Gospel, Jesus is often in a conflict situation with the leaders or elite of the Jewish people. This text is quite a contrast. This scribe came to Jesus to question him, probably seeking to entrap him in some way. Instead, the scribe sees that Jesus has a clear understanding of what God requires of us. The great commandments to love God and to love your neighbour as yourself

summarise all the requirements of the Law of Moses. The Scribe rightly sees that it is in the actions of loving God and neighbour in our daily lives that we really respond properly to God's call. This is more important than the legalistic requirements of worship in the Temple with burnt offerings and sacrifices on the altar. Because of his agreement with the vision of Jesus, the scribe is declared 'not far from the kingdom of God'.

MAKING CONNECTIONS

- What for you is the greatest aspect of your faith? What does it mean to love God with all our heart, understanding and strength? What does it mean to love our neighbour as ourselves?
- Use today's Psalm as an affirmation of faith:
I love you, Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my saviour. My God is the rock where I take refuge; my shield, my mighty help, my stronghold. The Lord is worthy of all praise: when I call I am saved from my foes.
