FIRST READING

Acts 5:27-32,40-41

The high priest demanded an explanation of the Apostles. 'We gave you a formal warning' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. By his own right hand God has now raised him up to be leader and saviour, to give repentance and forgiveness of sins through him to Israel. We are witnesses to all this, we and the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.' They warned the apostles not to speak in the name of Jesus and released them. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name.

In my vision, I, John, heard the sound of an immense number of angels gathered round the throne and the animals and the elders; there were ten thousand times ten thousand of them and thousands upon thousands, shouting, 'The Lamb that was sacrificed is worthy to be given power, riches, wisdom, strength, honour, glory and blessing.' Then I heard all the living things in creation – everything that lives in the air, and on the ground, and under the ground, and in the sea, crying, 'To the One who is sitting on the throne and to the Lamb, be all praise, honour, glory and power, for ever and ever.' And the four animals said, 'Amen'; and the elders prostrated themselves to worship.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA'S HISTORY FESTIVAL

St Joseph's, Willunga Quinn Memorials

James William Quinn, commemorated on one of the windows at St Joseph's Church, lived from 1861 to 1904.

His wife, Dorothy Ann Quinn, who died in 1941, is commemorated on the baptismal font with their son James Andrew, who died at 41 in 1940.

James William Quinn and his wife Dora (Dorothy Ann) were licensees of the Willunga Hotel from 1897. Tragedy struck the family when their six month

old daughter, Dorothy Ann, died in 1903, followed by her father James William in 1904.

Dora continued as licensee of the hotel after her husband's death.

During the First World War, Dora was a loyal contributor to the Cheer Up Society, a patriotic organisation in South Australia founded to provide creature comforts for soldiers. She worked energetically for the Willunga branch, forwarding to the Cheer-up Hut in Adelaide, weekly hampers and cases of fruit and parcels of woollen goods and kitbags.

In 1919, Dora hosted some of the soldiers who attended a demonstration in aid of the Returned Soldiers' and Sailors' Building Fund on the recreation ground. The activities included horse races, sports, fancy dress, afternoon tea, the McLaren Vale Brass Band and, in the evening, the Returned Soldiers' Orchestra concert. The soldiers were entertained for the weekend by, among others, Mrs Quinn, with an outing to Port Willunga.

Dora Quinn also hosted members of the orchestra from North Adelaide Blind Institution for a weekend in 1919 when they gave a grand concert in the Agricultural Hall. After the war, Dora continued to run the hotel with the help of Molly and Andrew. Andrew was a keen lawn bowler and Molly enjoyed playing croquet at the Willunga club. Andrew died in November 1940 at 40 years of age and, after Dorothy's death in March 1941, Molly took over the hotel. Molly remained at the hotel until she sold the lease in January 1949 and moved to Adelaide. The Willunga Hotel had been in the family for 52 years.

The Quinn family were active members of St Joseph's Parish and are all buried in the cemetery. Molly featured in social and fund raising events at the church and continued her support of charities until her death in 1995 at the age of 94.



Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?' He answered, 'Yes Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He replied, 'Yes, Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Look after my sheep.' Then he said to him a third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and said, 'Lord, you know

everything; you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep.

'I tell you most solemnly, when you were young you put on your own belt and walked where you liked; but when you grow old you will stretch out your hands, and somebody else will put a belt round you and take you where you would rather not go.'

In these words he indicated the kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God. After this he said, 'Follow me.'

DID YOU KNOW?

- The Sea of Galilee is also known as the Sea of Tiberias.
- Jesus' triple repetition of his question to Peter, 'Do you love me?' echoes the three denials of Jesus by Peter on the morning of his execution.
- The Greek word for fish, icthus, is an acronym of the Greek words for 'Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour'. The fish was an early symbol used by Christians to denote Christ.
- The appearance of Jesus to the disciples in last week's gospel occurred in the upper room in Jerusalem where they had celebrated the Passover feast. Here, the disciples have returned to Galilee in the north.
- Early tradition holds that Peter met his death by being crucified upside down in Rome.
