#### **FIRST READING**

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

#### PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL 2017 REPORT

Every week, we print the collections for the previous weekend in the Parish Bulletin. However, these figures don't really give parishioners any idea of our overall financial situation. The weekly figures vary considerably depending on how many parishioners attend Mass (7.30am Mass is not good for the coffers!), the number of visitors, whether those involved with Planned Giving are on holidays (or if they are making up their weekly pledges on their return), special Sundays like Mothers' or Fathers' Days, special family days and, of course, Christmas and Easter.

Parishes need money to function. The money we receive from the Second Collection each week is vital for the smooth-running of our Parish. We also rely heavily on the generosity of past parishioners (eg Richard Logan and Annie O'Connnor), who established Parish Trust Funds. In general, because of the terms of the wills of these people, we can only use the interest from some of these Trusts and can't legally touch any capital.

As well as the day-to-day expenses like Parish Office expenses (photocopying, stationery, phone, postage, etc), Mass expenses (candles, hosts, wine, etc) we also pay Council rates, insurance, property maintenance and upgrades, donations to local groups including 5CY (Yankalilla), Southern Vales Ministry and others, cemetery maintenance, coresponsibility with other Parishes in our cluster for Priest expenses and much more. On top of all these costs, we are still servicing a debt for the Parish building fund.

At recent meetings of the Parish Finance Council, it was moved that we should publish an annual balance sheet in the Parish Bulletin. Our parish financial records are audited by an independent auditor every year, to ensure they are maintained according to Diocesan requirements.



I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete.


This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you.

A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command you.

I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father.

You did not choose me: no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name.

What I command you is to love one another.'



#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

In John's Gospel there is no account of the last meal that Jesus shared with his disciples. Instead there is the account of Jesus washing the feet of his disciples, an act of absolute service to others, and a long discourse of instruction on how they must conduct themselves in the future. This is known as the 'Farewell Discourse' and part of it is read this Sunday and next week.

#### **EXPLORING THE WORD**

The heart of today's gospel lies in Jesus repeating himself: 'Love one another'. The model for this love is the love that Jesus showed towards all those who follow him. Jesus has changed the way in which God relates to human beings. We are no longer servants of God but are drawn into deep intimacy and friendship through the Son. This new relationship is not dependent on our choice or will. God has chosen us and we are now commissioned to bear fruit, fruit that will last. The

Christian command to love is not a vague feeling of good will; it is a love which suffers all, and may demand great sacrifice. The command to love as Jesus loved may be the most difficult test of our Christianity. This is how the presence of Jesus is experienced even in his absence.

#### MAKING CONNECTIONS

- When have you experienced complete joy? What or who brought that sensation on for you?
- Have you ever found that love is a costly and demanding emotion?
- What does it mean to love one another as Christ loved us?
- Today's Entrance Antiphon makes a lovely reflection for the week:

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: the Lord has freed his people, alleluia.
