Such is the richness of the grace which he has showered on us in all wisdom and insight. He has let us know the mystery of his purpose, the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end: that he would bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth.

And it is in him that we were claimed as God's own, chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory, the people who would put their hopes in Christ before he came.

Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you too have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.

Thankfully, I've never been seriously sick or injured. I haven't needed anyone to tend to me physically since I got my wisdom teeth out as a teenager. Which is a good thing since I have an irrational phobia about going to the doctor. Even something as little as getting a shot makes me nervous.

So, I was pretty anxious about getting the COVID vaccine. Regardless, I of course signed up to get it as soon as I was eligible. I was overwhelmed with relief when I learned my friend Jane would be volunteering at the clinic I was going to. She texted me with reassurances all morning until I got there, and when I arrived, everyone who ushered me through the process was just so kind. The woman who gave me the shot had me breathe slowly with her for a few minutes beforehand to relax me. I think I exhaled a whole year's worth of fear while looking into her caring face.

All those healings Jesus performed, and his disciples after him - it had always seemed to me that there was an inordinate emphasis on them. But I get it now, what a miracle of love it is to make someone - body and mind - healthy and safe.



COMPLIANCE WITH REGULATIONS

(Current from 5 July, 2021)

- The total number of people in Church must not exceed 3 people per 4 square metres. Social distancing principles apply. Every person should attempt to stay at least 1.5 metres from others. However, this does not apply to people who live together, who are friends or family members, or people who regularly associate with each other.

- For places of worship, masks must be worn when capacity exceeds 75% of normal occupancy. If capacity is at or below 75%, no masks are required.

- Singing as a congregation may recommence, provided masks are worn.

- Consumption of beverages (eg cuppa following Mass) and food may be resumed, provided Covid restrictions are strictly implemented. (Please ring the Parish Office for more details.)

- There should be no shaking of hands or holding hands during the Mass.

- Every gathering must record contact details - either with the QR code for smart phones, or the handwritten log - both located at the entrance to the Church.

- Hand sanitizer is to be available at church entrances.

- Offertory procession will be omitted. Communion is given only in hands. Precious Blood will not be distributed.

- Collection plates will not be passed around but a single drop point is provided at the churches.

- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.

- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.

- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people should be encouraged not to attend.

- Care should be taken at the dismissal and on leaving the church to minimise social contact.

- The Archdiocese recommends Covid vaccination for all (please check with your GP if you have concerns).

- The obligation for Sunday Mass for the laity HAS NOT BEEN RE-INVOKED at this stage.

Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff – no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals but, he added, ‘Do not take a spare tunic.’ And he said to them, ‘If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.’ So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.

pedigree, and reference books by the score to keep me in the arena of orthodoxy. Yet I’m not certain that demons are at all intimidated by these things. Though institutions may grant credibility, only God can provide the authority for ministry. And God grants it to slackers like Peter, not much of a fisherman but possessed of interesting impulses; to James and John, much admired by their mother, at least; and even to Judas, more loyal to himself than to the Lord. It seems God favours those who are willing to stay on the road and travel light. The walking stick is the best credential of all.

What do you carry, in your heart and on your back, that limits your ability to serve?

Time to lighten the load! Identify one element in your life - a relationship, attitude, behaviour - that chronically keeps you from progressing on the spiritual journey. Take steps to reconcile, heal, and move forward.

Don’t think you need a lot of extra equipment for this. You are the equipment. No special appeal for funds. Keep it simple.

NOTHING BUT A WALKING STICK



Jesus sent out his disciples without a degree in theology, without a certificate from a diocesan training program, and without a catechism.

Two-by-two, they walked along with no more than a pair of sandals and a walking stick, both crucial to keep them on the journey. With so little, they still summoned the authority to cast out demons, heal the sick, and preach repentance.
