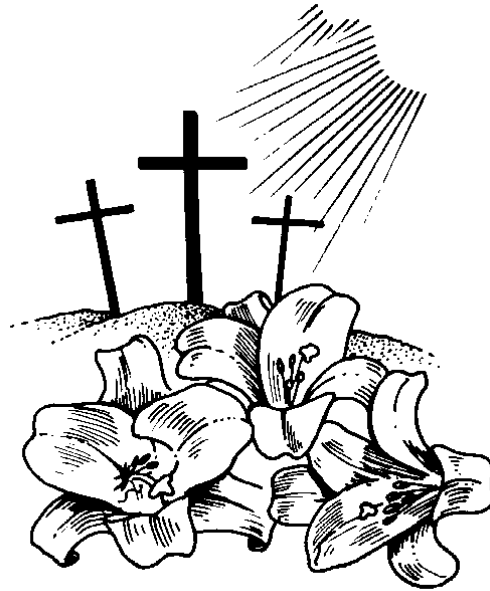

## FIRST READING

*Acts 10:34, 37-43*

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

*Colossians 3:1-4*

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

parish. By that time he had changed from a man craving daily heroin fixes to a man craving daily Mass. Once a man who worried only about finding money for his drugs, James now asks regularly how he can help others in his parish.

I can assure you, James believes Jesus rose from the dead.

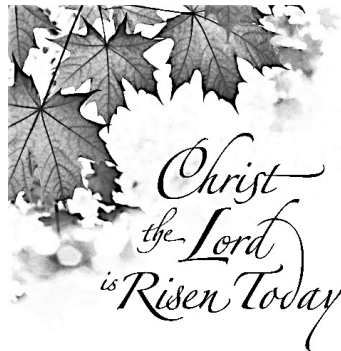
Today we celebrate God's victory over death. The Resurrection proves that nothing can keep us from following Jesus is we call out for God's strength. We can stand up for what's right, though others may attack us. A life of sacrifice for others is possible and meaningful, though society says otherwise. Peace and freedom can be ours even though we might feel controlled by pain, fear, or bad habits.

This Easter, be like the disciple who entered the tomb and "saw and believed". See how God's power has raised others. Talk to other Christians about how God has freed them from personal problems or

strengthened them to do the right thing. Where do you need strength or a new start? Do you feel trapped in a bad habit? Where do you need courage to stand for what is right or fix a broken relationship? Ask God for help. Your "resurrection" might not happen instantly. But through daily prayer and help from other people, someday you'll realise, just like my friend James, that you've found new life, hope, and strength.

Where do you need the hope, peace, and freedom of the Resurrection in your life right now?

‘They have taken the Lord out of the tomb’ she said ‘and we don’t know where they have put him.’

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

### DID YOU KNOW?

- The Easter Triduum (which means ‘three days’), lasting from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday evening, is the climax of the Church’s year.
- Holy Thursday is sometimes known as Maundy Thursday, a corruption of the Latin word for commandment, *mandatum*. This is to commemorate the ‘new commandment’ that Jesus gave his followers at the Last Supper: Love one another as I have loved you.
- Good Friday and Easter Saturday are the only days of the year on which Mass is not celebrated.

## MAKING CONNECTIONS

- The cross and the paschal candle are the central symbols of these three days. Death is conquered in new life. The darkness of the tomb is conquered by the light of Christ. Much of this symbolism is present in the baptism ceremony of the Easter Vigil.
- ‘There is no need for you to be afraid.’ How have your fears been laid to rest with the events of this night?
