PAY THE RANSOM

A few years ago, teen hazing rituals were making news. Reports told how young people humiliated and sometimes physically injured younger teens as a way to initiate them into sports teams or school traditions. One ritual called for football players to hold down, strip, and humiliate younger players. Another encouraged school leaders to throw garbage on younger students. Some "just" called for older teens to surround and intimidate younger students in the corridors and grounds.

Hazing has always saddened and angered me. It frightens or hurts young people. It teaches young people to enjoy humiliating others. It holds up failed leadership as good leadership.





I think failed leadership saddened and angered Jesus too. In this Gospel Jesus sees how James and John are looking for leadership perks that will give them power over others. Was he angry or sad when he told all the Apostles, "It shall not be so among you"? Who knows? But Jesus saw how leaders in his time abused authority and used it to abuse others, especially those who were weak. He was determined to teach his leaders to use authority differently. He used his life as the model to follow.

Jesus' life was a ransom, he says. That means it freed people. And, like Jesus, young people have the ability to free younger teens or to imprison them. Hazing imprisons teens in fear and humiliation. But older teens can free younger teens by befriending them, by defending them, by helping them learn new skills, and by showing them how to sacrifice for others.

Jesus clearly defines Christian leadership and asks you to consider whether you will offer it to teammates, classmates, and younger brothers and sisters.

While Jesus is talking about becoming ransom, his followers are looking for glory. No wonder Jesus groans that they don't know what they're talking about. Of the four gospel writers, Mark is most likely to draw the disciples as out-and-out dumbbells. Since it's the first of the gospels to be written down, Mark's depiction is likely closer to the truth than the other evangelists cared to be.

Alas, these dumbbells are closer to revealing our natural inclinations than we care to admit. We step up to drink the cup of Christ in our Eucharist without much fuss, but when it comes time to share his passion in even the smallest sense. we don't respond to roll call. We're willing to take part in the rituals of religion, but we're nowhere to be found when it's time to be ransom. Servant-hood has little appeal. Still we're prepared to join in the fingerpointing at James and John seeking credit. We, at least, cover our aspirations a little better than they GPBS eNews do.



be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their socalled rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt.

This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

DID YOU KNOW?

- The brothers, James and John, sons of Zebedee, were nicknamed by Jesus 'sons of thunder'.
- Acts 12:2 reports the martyrdom of James. He was killed, probably by decapitation, by Herod Agrippa, grandson of Herod the Great, during a persecution of the early Church.
- According to some traditions John survived until the end of the first century and lived in Ephesus.

EXPLORING THE WORD

On three occasions Jesus has told his disciples of his approaching passion and death (Mk 8:31; 9:31; 10:32– 34). Here James and John enthusiastically, if somewhat naively, commit themselves to following him in drinking the cup and undergoing the baptism which Jesus faces. Do they really understand the cost of discipleship? Their question to Jesus would indicate that they have still not fully grasped what it means to follow Jesus. They want him to do their will rather than them doing the will of the Father. They still seem to be thinking in terms of a political and earthly kingdom where power and riches will come to those who are in special places of favour at the right and left hand of the ruler. Instead, Jesus offers them a share in his suffering and death. The other disciples too display their human weakness in their indignation that they may be left out. Jesus tries again to make it clear to his foolish disciples that their view of the world, locked as it is in their earthly experience, is not how God plans things to be. Christianity is not a state where power and authority is lorded over others. Instead it is a call to service and humility and may come at great cost.

THE PRAYER OF ST IGNATIUS LOYOLA

Lord Jesus teach me to be generous, to serve you as you deserve to be served, to give without counting the cost, to fight without heeding the wounds, to work without seeking rest, to spend my life without expecting any other return than the knowledge that I do your will.
