

"I write to encourage you attend the upcoming 'Walk for Life" on Saturday 11 February, 2023.

With the passing of legislation last year, abortion up to birth in some circumstances is now legal in South Australia. However, the witness to the value, and dignity of every human life from the earliest stages in the mother's womb must be continued.



COMPLIANCE WITH COVID-19 REGULATIONS

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 please follow the instructions as per SA Health in terms of contact tracing and isolating yourself as per government health protocols. Please stay home and do not attend church services until you have fully recovered.
- Wearing of face-masks in Church is strongly recommended.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people are requested to stay home and not attend services.
- Hand sanitiser is available at church entrances.
- Communion is given only in hands. Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- Procession of gifts has resumed.
- Collection plates are to be passed around with minimum contact

DID YOU KNOW?

- This collection of sayings is known as the Beatitudes, which means blessings.
- This text is also known as the Sermon on the Mount. Luke also has a version of this text, but it is set on a plain by the Sea of Galilee (Luke 6:20-26).
- Just as Moses received the Law onMt Sinai, Matthew situates Jesus giving the new law on a mountain.
- There are a number of instances in his Gospel where Matthew parallels Jesus with Moses. Again, this may be to appeal to the largely Jewish audience of his own community.



(Continued from page 1) began to speak. This is what he taught them:

- 'How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle: they shall have the earth for their heritage. Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied. Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God.
- Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who are persecuted in
- the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'



CLASSICS ANEW

Certain pieces of music have had an incredible impact on my life. The first time I heard Pachelbel's "Canon in D Major," I was brought to tears. I felt the same way when I heard Ralph Vaughn William's "Adagio for Strings" and the Righteous Brothers' "Unchained Melody". These three pieces remain favourites of mine and still have a huge impact on me. But nothing can replace the very first time I heard them.

Our gospel this weekend is one of the most important passages in all of scripture. The Beatitudes are the sum total of the meaning of salvation that Jesus came to share with us. They were destined to become the guideposts of who we are, even more than what we do, as Christians. They are radical in their outlook, challenging those who hear them to look at the world and all they value in new and different ways.

Imagine the very first time the Beatitudes were heard by the crowd and the disciples sitting on the side of the hill. Most probably fled, some in disgust, others laughing at Jesus' naïveté, and some in fear of the power of his message. The disciples must have felt something stir within them that would be dormant until the Spirit anointed them on the first Pentecost.

We've heard these words at weddings, at funerals, at Sunday Mass, and at prayer services. So perhaps they have lost some of their impact. Can we try to hear them as though we've never heard them before? Maybe not. But let's listen more closely the next time the words "Blessed are ..." are proclaimed to our ears and hearts.

The Commissioning:

Go from here to be God's blessing. We will nurture our spiritual life. We will comfort those who suffer loss. We will affirm the humble. We will search diligently for the truth-tellers. We will find the compassionate way and live it. We will be light in the dark places. We will follow the peaceful way. We will be ready to pay the price for faithful living.
