THE LAW OF KARMA

Canadian writer, theologian and social activist Mary Jo Leddy, in her wonderful book "Radical Gratitude", claims that one of the great principles innate within reality itself is this: "The air you breathe into the universe is the air that it will breathe back and if your energy is right, it will renew itself even as you give it away." Jesus puts it this way: "The measure you measure out is the measure you will be given." The air you breathe out is the air you will re-inhale.

We'd like, of course, to think that we're breathing out the air of gratitude, generosity, forgiveness, honesty, blessing, self-effacement, joy, delight. We'd also like to believe that we are breathing out the air of concern for the poor, the suffering, the unattractive, the bothersome. And



we'd like to believe too that we're big-hearted people, breathing out understanding and reconciliation.

However too often we're blind to what's really going on inside us and are unconsciously breathing out the air of arrogance, self-interest, pettiness, jealousy, competition, fear, paranoia, dishonesty, interest in others only when it's convenient, and are emitting signals that others are a threat to us as we seek attention and popularity, and jostle with them for sexual, financial, and professional position.

Is it any mystery then that our lives are full of competition, jealousy, bitterness, anger, accusation, and false judgement? Is it a mystery why so often, beneath a polite surface, there is so much thinly disguised competition, jealousy, and non-forgiveness around? We're breathing these things into the world, should we be surprised that we're re-inhaling them? The measure we're measuring out is the measure that we're receiving.

To the big of heart, who breathe out what's large and honest and full of blessing, the world will return a hundredfold in kind, honesty and blessing that swells the heart even more. Conversely to the miserly of heart and dishonest of spirit, the world will give back too in kind, pettiness and lies that shrink the heart still further.

That's the deep mystery at the centre of the universe. The air we breathe out into the world is the air we will re-inhale.

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twelve years; after long and painful treatment under various doctors, she spent all she had without being any the better for it, in fact, she was getting worse. She had heard about Jesus, and she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his cloak. 'If I can touch even his clothes,' she had told herself 'I shall be well again.' And the source of the bleeding dried up instantly, and she felt in herself that she was cured of her complaint. Immediately aware that power had gone out from him, Jesus turned round in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' His disciples said to him, 'You see how the crowd is pressing round you and yet you say, "Who touched me?"' But he continued to look all round to see who had done it. Then the woman came forward, frightened and trembling because she knew what had happened to her, and she fell at his feet and told him the whole truth. 'My daughter,' he said 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint.'

While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kumi!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.

GOD TO US:

MEET ME ANYWHERE

It's a familiar, charming story passed on from time to time: It is said that a little boy wanted to meet God, so he packed his backpack with goodies and set off on his journey. In short order, he found that it was time for a snack, so he sat down on the nearest park bench and opened his stash. He noticed an old woman at the other end of the bench who looked a little hungry, so he offered her half of his cupcake. She smiled and accepted it with pleasure. He then offered her some of his lemonade, which she accepted with another smile. They sat quietly thinking about things without saying a word. Finally as it got dark he got up to leave and waved a good-bye. Then he offered her a hug. Both the boy and the woman went home happy – each quite sure they had met God in the park that day (though, the woman tells her daughter at home, "God's a lot younger than I expected.").

What to make of the mysterious phrase that Jesus "realised that power had gone out of him"? We all project attitudes and even powers, "vibes" that let others know they're welcome or not, that here is a listener, even a healer. What vibes do I give off? Signals that say, "Don't bother me"? Or are my Christian charity and compassion so evident that comfort and even healing might flow from me?
